

ELECTION '25 COST OF LIVING + ECONOMIC RELIEF

Current Situation

- Over 3.7 million people in Australia are living under the poverty line of 50% of medium income
- 12% of Western Australians live in poverty, with a total of 94,000 children
- JobSeeker and other payments are well below the poverty line
- Cost of living and demand for emergency relief and food access has soared
- Increase in reliance on buy now pay later and credit cards
- Limited full-time entry level jobs and increasing gig economy

Proposed Changes

FEDERAL/STATE

- State & Federal Minimum Wage setting to be adequate to support a reasonable standard of living for working people and their families
- Universal access to high quality early childhood education and care with no out-of-pocket costs for the lowest income earners and prioritising accessibility in regional areas
- Financial counselling & coaching
 - specialist financial counsellors for family & domestic violence, mental health, gambling, & people exiting institutions.
 - Investment in financial wellbeing and prevention programs
- Broadband to be regulated as an essential utility and ensuring a low income product or concession

FEDERAL

- JobSeeker and other income support rates raised to at least \$80/day for singles and adjusted for other household types
- Income thresholds increased to allow people on income support payments to earn a modest amount before scaling back benefits
- Social security waiting periods amended to allow modest savings and a financial buffer while receiving income support payments.
- Reform the employment services system:
 - Abolish financial penalties for noncompliance
 - Remove activity requirements that impede a person's employability
 - Employment pathways that are personalised, flexible, & place-based e.g: <u>Hopscotch</u>
- A measurable definition of poverty with a statutory requirement to reduce poverty

STATE

- Emergency relief increased funding for food, fuel vouchers, rent relief, medical bill relief, family and domestic violence relief
- Expand utility grants & concessions to broaden eligibility access, increase grant limits, cover all outstanding debt, fund efficiency programs, & remove administration / transaction fees for low-income households
- Transport concessions extended from Age Pension recipients to all Health Care Card holders
