# FOYER TURNS 10

This year Foyer Oxford celebrates a decade of providing high quality housing and holistic support to over 800 young people at risk of, or experiencing homelessness.

Launched in 2014 by Anglicare WA, Foundation Housing and North Metropolitan TAFE with support from the WA Government and philanthropic supporters, Foyer Oxford opened its doors to support 98 residents, including 24 young parents and their children.

All young people deserve a safe, stable home environment, filled with encouragement and support, but that isn't the reality for many Western Australians. Foyer's unique combination of accommodation, emotional support, guidance and foundational skill development is the formula to our success.

Former resident Kim, will be forever grateful to all Foyer staff for being there when she lost access to safe and stable accommodation. "My case worker was incredible – it felt like having an angel walk beside you. Having people who were actually interested in me and all my ups and downs, to listen to me, be an advisor... a cheerleader... to be the person I did not have growing up. Having encouraging and positive mentors who cared about and changed my whole outlook on myself and my life," Kim said. "Through Foyer's support, I finished my university degree, I gained employment and most importantly I feel happier and safer than I was before". 

# ALICE KINGSNORTH SCHOLARSHIP 10<sup>TH</sup>ANNIVERSARY

The Alice Kingsnorth Scholarship is a long-running partnership between Anglicare WA and the Kingsnorth family, created as a memorial to their daughter, Alice.

Alice was the much-loved daughter of Dudley, Jane and Christine, and sister to Oliver and Rhys. She was a fun-loving girl who adored her pets, loved her music and going to movies. She excelled at school and had dreams of starting her own business with an 'international flavour'. Her weekend job was important to her as she was saving for her dream trip overseas. Throughout her life, Alice had a wide circle of friends, and was deeply concerned for the welfare of others.

Sadly, in her later years of high school, Alice began to withdraw from her regular social life and to self-harm, a manifestation of severe depression. Despite the unconditional love and support of her family as well as receiving professional help, Alice lost her sense of selfworth, taking her own life after several attempts. International Scholarship was established to honour Alice's dedication to helping others. Recipients of the scholarships have travelled overseas to collaborate with industry leaders and upon their return deliver educational sessions to their colleagues on key learnings.

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the scholarship, which has enabled 17 Anglicare WA frontline staff members to advance their professional development.

The scholarship's contributions continue to be integrated throughout the WA Community Services sector. The Kingsnorth family are generous supporters of the work our staff do on the front lines. The legacy they have created in honour of their daughter Alice is improving the lives of so many Western Australians.

## \$200,000 raised and counting...



Complimenting this is a second campaign managed by a dedicated group of individuals

## SPOTLIGHT ON HOUSING: **ENSURING EVERYONE HAS A HOME**

#### **RENTAL SURVEY INSIGHTS**

#### Anglicare WA's advocacy team is focused on challenging the current housing crisis.

In April Anglicare WA hosted the "Housing Crisis – How did we get here and what can be done?" lecture and panel discussion in conjuction with the release of the annual Rental Affordability Snapshot. The Snapshot helps people understand how our rental market is changing and the implications for Western Australians on low incomes and at risk of or moving into homelessness. You can download a copy of the **Rental Affordability** Snapshot report by scanning the QR code below at the bottom of this page.

Safe, secure, and healthy homes for all Western Australians will continue to be an advocacy priority for Anglicare WA this year. We are seeking the following government policy initiatives:

- Creating a state based rental affordability scheme to increase the supply of affordable rentals available to low - and moderate-income tenants.
- Committing to target of 6% of WA total housing stock as social housing
- Establishing a WA Housing Future Fund to fund new social and affordable housing builds.
- Reforming tax and other incentives to increase the supply and mix of low-cost housing.
- Implementing second stage reforms to the Residential Tenancies Act including: removal of no-grounds evictions; establishing rent stabilization; introducing minimum standards for rental properties and extending legal protection to boarders and lodgers
- Ensuring all public, social and private rental housing meets minimum efficiency standards to reduce energy costs.
- Expanding crisis, transitional and supported accommodation options for people living with complex needs, particularly in regional, rural, and remote areas
